PROJECT UPDATES

Schedule Change: Highway 30 – Central Ave (CSAH 7) to Second Ave NE

Due to overhead power line relocation work taking place from Third Ave NE to Highway 22, work on Highway 30 from Central Ave to Second Ave NE will start earlier than originally scheduled. This change will allow the power company to continue their relocation work and the contractor to continue with street and utility construction. The concrete pavement and sidewalks are anticipated to be removed this week so that the underground utility work can begin thereafter. Traffic on Central Ave (CSAH 7) will be able to cross the intersection of TH 30 to access Main Street.

Highway 30 – Cemetery to Central Ave

Work is continuing to progress with both underground utility work and roadway work. The contractor will be following behind placing the granular materials that are needed to construct the roadway.

Central Ave (CSAH 7) Intersection

The underground utility work in the intersection of Highway 30 and Central Ave has been completed. The intersection was reopened to Central Ave traffic last Friday with temporary gravel surfacing.

Highway 30 – 6th Ave NE to Highway 22

The work on Highway 30 from Sixth Ave NE to Highway 22 has been rescheduled. Work in this area is anticipated to begin in the next few weeks after the power company has completed the relocation of their overhead power lines.

Work Along Highway 22

The driveway restoration work and final grading of the ditches will take place as drier soil conditions allow. The recent wet weather has delayed this work from taking place.
