

## Malm Wins 2004 Young Engineer of the Year Award

Brian Malm, a Project Manager in the Mankato office, has been awarded the 2004 Young Engineer of the Year Award from the Minnesota Society of Professional Engineers. The award recognizes outstanding achievements by a young engineer under the age of 35. Specific requirements include engineering achievements, professional experience, educational and collegiate achievements, professional society activities, technical society activities, civic and humanitarian activities and continuing competence.

Brian is currently the Consulting Engineer for the City of Eagle Lake and a Project Manager for the City of North Mankato as well as several private developers. He is currently responsible for supervising projects totaling approximately \$5 million in construction. Brian's engineering responsibilities include: planning, design, preparation of construction plans, specifications and reports. Some recent projects of interest that Brian has designed include: sanitary sewer lift stations for the cities of Waterville, Waseca and Madison Lake; water distribution system analysis for the City of Belle Plaine; water towers for the cities of Janesville and Belle Plaine; and individual sewage treatment systems for Washington and Aitkin Counties. He realizes the importance of continuing education and recently earned a Master of Science Degree in Infrastructure Systems Engineering from the University of Minnesota while working full-time.



Brian has been an active member of the Traverse Des Sioux (TDS) Chapter for many years. He has served as Secretary, Treasurer, Vice President and President of the Chapter. He is currently a member of the Executive Committee where he chairs the Scholarship Committee. He also serves as MSPE's representative on the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency's Individual Sewage Treatment System Advisory Board. He is also involved in the local community and has taught 3-4 year old Sunday school classes in his church.
