What Needs an Architectural History **Survey or Interpretation?**

Community interpretation may be needed as mitigation for an adverse effect to an eligible or listed historic property. Our cultural resource and design team can develop interpretive nodes such as signage, wayfinding, and plagues/markers to share the interesting and significant events that helped shape the community into what it is today.
