

Safe Routes to School (SRTS) is an initiative that works to make it safe, convenient, and fun for children to walk and bike to and from school. SRTS can lessen congestion related issues while promoting safety and increasing health and physical activity.

#### THE PROBLEM

Schools are struggling with heavy traffic congestion during arrival and dismissal. Many schools have not been adequately designed to handle traffic from parents choosing to drive their kids to school. In 1969, nearly 50 percent of children in the United States (and nearly 90 percent of those within a mile of school) walked or biked to school. Today, that number has plummeted to fewer than 15 percent. During the morning commute, driving to school represents 10-14 percent of traffic.

Studies show that SRTS programs are effective at increasing rates of walking and biking to school and decreasing injuries.

#### **FUNDING PROGRAMS**

Congress created the Federal-Aid Safe Routes to School Program in 2005 through comprehensive transportation legislation, ultimately resulting in nearly \$1 billion in funding. SRTS activities are eligible to compete for funding alongside other programs.
